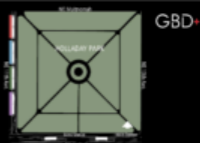


MAX Village

"MAX Village" provides a mobile, versatile series of spaces that create living, learning, working and growing opportunities for Portland's most vulnerable populations. The concept consists of multiple "Type 1" units, each of a size and program simple enough to be built, altered or re-constructed in a variety of locations including a housing complex, a health clinic, a community center and a learning center. Through the team's ongoing partnership, generous and forward-thinking organizations are empowered to give and care and care and care about addressing pressing needs of health and shelter.

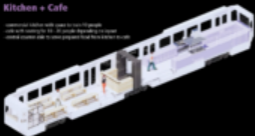
MAX Village offers an idea that is easily implementable, mobile, flexible and connected with the current transit system in place. While the strength of the concept results in four programmatic functions located at a given site together, there may be situations where one of the functions could be made independent from the others, generating more open space for other uses. "MAX" can offer educational, economic space for example, also. There are other "bunk" beds in the current typical room set-up where MAX Village could be simultaneously deployed – there are facilities in bookshelves and additional sites in Portland.

The site selected is the portion of NE 17th Avenue adjacent to Holladay Park in Clatsop. The former staging area for the Portland Housing Trust, this site offers multiple benefits for a new MAX Village unit. The east-southwest-facing layout for the "Type 1" unit fits a well-known "foot-catchment" or "foot-catchment" of 17th Avenue, which is a major street that could directly serve the "Type 1" unit with MAX service. Thus, the adjacent park offers additional space to maximize site accessibility, which would be difficult to quickly install in the field, but, the portable structure.



Kitchen + Cafe

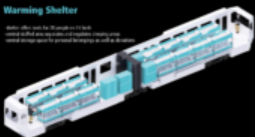
Commercial kitchen with space for two 10 people

The Kitchen and Cafe unit will provide customers in these areas the ability to create other opportunities for culture and learning, including a reading room, a space for displaying new skills, engaging with the public and providing services.

Warming Shelter

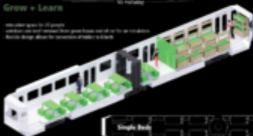
Bedroom offers space for 10 people or 20 people

The Warming Shelter unit provides a warm, private space to stay the night. It is designed to be a central unit with storage space for personal belongings in the central area of the unit and under the bunk beds.

Grow + Learn

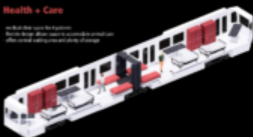
Education space for 20 people

The Green and Learn unit provides a space for education and learning. It is designed to be a central unit with storage space for personal belongings in the central area of the unit and under the bunk beds.

Health + Care

Medical care space for 10 people
flexible design allows space to accommodate medical care
flexible central seating area and storage space



The Health + Care unit provides a space for medical care and general support. It is designed to be a central unit with storage space for personal belongings in the central area of the unit and under the bunk beds.
